Egyptian students and academic staff have faced a huge wave of repression since the military deposed Muslim Brotherhood president Mohamed Morsi in July 2013, and crushed protests by his followers killing at least 500 in one incident in August. According to Amnesty International at least 500 students had been arrested by January 2014. At Cairo University and Al-Azhar University at least 8 students have been killed by the police during protests.
