

Solidarity with Egyptian political prisoners

Since the overthrow of Mohamed Morsi in July 2013, Egypt's military regime has jailed tens of thousands and sentenced hundreds to death in kangaroo courts.

Yet Western governments continue to supply the bullets which kill protesters on the streets, and roll out the red carpet to welcome the dictator and his entourage.

British companies are investing heavily in Egypt. Tory Foreign Secretary Philip Hammond has made it clear that profits are more important that human rights.

The prisoners named on this leaflet are only a small fraction of the thousands unjustly detained in Egypt today.

They come from all walks of life, all ages and hold political opinions across the full spectrum of opposition to the current regime: from the Muslim Brotherhood to

the Revolutionary Socialists and 6th of April Youth Movement.

The political prisoners

- Journalists Abdallah Fakharany and Samhi Moustafa have been given 25 year sentences after an unfair trial.
- Sisters Hind and Rasha Munir are also in jail for life, simply for attending a protest against the military killing of demonstrators in August 2013.
- Revolutionary socialist activists Mahienour el-Masry and Yousef Shaaban have been sentenced to 15 months in jail on trumpedup charges after the police attacked them. Mahienour and Yousef were among the organisers of the first demonstrations over the 2010 police murder of young activist Khaled Said which sparked the 2011 revolution.

- Ahmed Douma, an activist who led protests in 2011, was condemned to life in prison earlier this year.
- Alaa Abdelfattah is serving a five year sentence for attending a peaceful demonstration against military trials for civilians.
- His sister Sanaa Seif and human rights worker Yara Sallam were jailed after a similar protest on 21 June 2014
- Irish school student Ibrahim Halawa and doctor Ibrahim al-Yamani have not been sentenced, nearly two years after their arrest. They are defendants in a mass trial and could be facing the death penalty.
- Photojournalist Shawkan has been detained without trial since August 2013.
